Internship Project Description

Novel cadence detection for electric bicycles

Background

Pedal assist e-bikes are equipped with torque and/or cadence sensors. These sensors, wireless or wired, are attached to the crank, axel, or bottom bracket to detect if (and how much) a cyclist is pedaling. They act as primary input to the motor controller to regulate the power output to the motor. In the EU they also function as a figurative authorization switch, only providing power when the user is actually pedaling (otherwise it would be classified as a scooter).

Project Scope:

This internship project is your chance to think out of the box and put your technical skills to the test! Can you identify, build and demonstrate a novel means of detecting cadence/torque while eliminating the need for a traditional pedal sensor?

Project Deliverables:

Hardware and software prototypes. Report with analysis of results.
