

CARROLLTON AVENUE (736\* North)

Baltimore

SW corner of Carrollton Avenue and Lanvale Street

Three-story brick and stone house built ca. 1883 for William H. Lohmeyer [(1835-1910)], a prosperous haberdashery dealer who moved here from West Lexington Street and lived there for the rest of his life. His younger son, William E. Lohmeyer [(1865- )] stayed on for a year after his father's death; then the building was broken up into six apartments, which by 1936 were listed as the 'Kirkleigh Apartments' in tribute to the then-owner, Charles D. Kirkley. Al-
